Who Benefits & How: Catholic Charities' staff and volunteers serve over 5,900 people a year including children, families in crisis, vulnerable adults and seniors, refugees, the poor, the uninsured, and the unborn - **regardless of race, age, gender, or faith tradition.** *Space does not permit us to describe all the ways we help, but we can describe a few as shown below.*

- Our ***Pregnancy and Parenting Counseling Program*** helps birthparents make a well-thought out decision about what is best for them and their babies. The support and acceptance afforded birthparents help them realistically consider and evaluate the options of parenting or adoption.
- Our ***Common Good Retired and Senior Volunteer Program (RSVP)*** volunteers put their skills and life experience to work in the area communities. By providing community services, RSVP volunteers meet needs that local budgets often cannot afford.
- Using computer technology, the Internet, and old-fashioned face-to-face casework, our ***MediAppS*** program helps low income people lacking prescription drug insurance secure free medicines made available by the pharmaceutical companies.
