MISSION: House of Hope, Inc. is a treatment facility that provides a safe environment for individuals who desire to rebuild their lives from addictions.

GOALS:

- To provide comprehensive, life-changing treatment programs that address individual needs.
- To provide high quality facilities capable of responding to our community needs.
- To expand awareness of addiction and to promote a positive healing community.
- To build and maintain a fiscally responsible organization with the capability of meeting the needs of clients, community and staff.

BRIEF OVERVIEW:

Since 1971, House of Hope, Inc. has been assisting adults in their recovery from alcoholism and chemical dependency. It has grown from one house with 10 male residents to the current building with room for 29 adult men. In 2004 an outpatient program began within the walls. In 2006, House of Hope, Inc. obtained an additional house to provide services to 7 adult women. In 2007 another house was purchased and remodeled to serve as a “sober house” for 5 adult men needing a sober atmosphere in which to live after being discharged from a treatment program. 2011 saw another expansion of House of Hope, Inc. We have purchased a facility in Fairmont, MN that will provide services to an additional 26 adults. This facility will assist both men and women in their recover from chemical dependency.

WHO BENEFITS AND HOW:

- Residents: find sobriety, get jobs, increase their self-esteem and rebuild their lives.
- Families: get their loved ones back and rebuild relationships.
- Businesses: Get sober workers who are striving to become successful.
- Teachers/Students: get speakers and positive role models to talk about the destruction that alcohol/drugs had on their lives.
- Community: gets recovering chemically dependent men and women who become productive citizens by staying out of trouble, getting jobs and paying taxes.
