**Organizational Overview:** The Mankato Salvation Army demonstrates compassion, support, empowerment, and advocacy to those we serve. Through our programs and services we are able to provide immediate needs such as food, clothing, shelter, etc. The Mankato Salvation Army works with each client in identifying and overcoming barriers to create solutions to ensure long-term stability and success.

### Our Programs and Services:

- Emergency Social Services: *Assistance services including groceries, transportation, rent/utilities, medications, clothing, furniture, etc.*
- Noon Meal/Mobile Outreach Meal programs (summer food outreach)
- Seasonal Men’s Shelter
- Maxfield Place/Case Management Services: *Permanent supportive housing for homeless, disabled adults*
- Emergency Disaster Services
- Bundle Me Warm: *Provides warm winter clothing to families and individuals*
- Christmas Food Baskets
- Back to School: *Provides backpacks and necessary school supplies to children*

### Mankato Salvation Army 2010 Programs/Services Statistics:

- Noon Meal program served 35,224 meals; an average of 135 meals/day
- Our Mobile Outreach Meals served 5,011 meals during the summer months
- Seasonal Men’s Shelter provided 2,484 nights of lodging
- Emergency Social Services saw an increase in individuals served from the previous year while at the same time we saw a decrease in revenue
- Emergency Disaster Services responded to six disasters including major flooding, tornado damage, search and rescue operations, and train derailment
- Bundle Me Warm served 2,085 people
- Back to School assisted over 640 children

**Our Plan:** To continually seek to determine the unmet needs in our community. We will identify and access resources—human and material—from within and outside of our communities in order to meet such needs. Above all else, we will be people who care. Wherever we minister we will accept responsibility for the care of all God’s creation.
